# **Announcements December 6, 2020**

**Weekend Worship**: This weekend's worship theme for this, the second Sunday in Advent is titled "Repentant Preparation" based on Mark 1:1-8.

**Mid-week Advent Services:** This year's advent theme is titled "Isaiah Hope". This week's sermon title is "Personal Comfort". The services will be held at 11am and 6:30pm. We are asking those who will be coming to the 11am Advent service to mask for the whole service. Those coming to the 6:30pm service are invited to take off their masks once they sit down.

**Sunday Morning Zoom Bible Study:** Please contact Pastor Krenz if you would like to be part of this study, and he will send you the link. The time for this study is 9:30am-10am, so that people attending either Sunday worship service can either get home in time after the early service or make it to the late service. Our discussion this week will be over Isaiah 40:1-11, and 2 Peter 3:8-14.

**Christmas Program**: While we will not be having our regular Christmas program this year, every week during Advent a few young people will be assisting with an early reading in the service, and during the children's message reciting and reading key parts of the Christmas account.

Christmas Eve Services: At our last Elders meeting we decided to add a third Christmas Eve Service (2pm), and that service will be an all masked service. We ask everyone who plans to attend the 2pm, 4pm or 6:30pm services to sign up ahead of time online or call the church office so we do not over fill any of these services. Each service will have a limit of 50 people, and while people are still asked to wear their masks in and out of all the services, the 4pm and 6:30pm Christmas Eve Service will not require wearing a mask after one sits down in the pew.

**Sign Update**: The sign on Goodhaven Street should be up in the next two weeks. It was hoped that the sign on Route 3 would be up before Christmas, but it now looks like that will be installed the first part of January. Thank you to all who have donated toward the purchase of the sign. We have met the \$10,000 goal.
