Reformation Day, which focuses on "Justification", informs us why Thanksgiving, the coming of Christ at Advent, and the presence of Christ at Christmas are upcoming holidays worth celebrating.

The Sunday School Corner:



ASK THE PASTOR QUESTIONS - ANSWERS - TRUTH


