When was the last time you attended a family reunion? I love these gatherings -- they allow us a chance to slow down and catch up with everyone in the middle of our busy lives. Everyone checks in on how grandma and grandpa are doing, or dotes on the newest



baby in the family. In many ways, the church can also be thought of like a family gathering. Through the blood of Jesus, we all are connected and become members of His family, And, like our own families, the church spans generations, including everyone from infants to great-grandparents. The diversity of these multiple generations is a great strength to the church, especially when it comes to supporting families with children and youth in the congregation.

A 2017 research study of LCMS young adults showed when older adults from the congregation invested in students' lives, it made a huge impact! 

# Why do we learn from the catechism? Isn't learning the Bible enough?

In our church constitution it states that communicant members are to accept the Bible as the only rule and standard of faith (2 Timothy 3:14-17). In addition, members are to understand and accept the teachings of Luther's Small catechism, which was written in 1529, as an ordered summary of what the Bible states about the Christian faith.

The catechism was not intended to merely be a reference book, rather a devotional aid reflecting on

- •the God who gives us His law in the 10 commandments;
- •what we are to believe in the creeds;
- •the why and how of praying in the Lord's Prayer;
- and the personalized gifts of the Lord's Supper, Baptism, and confession/absolution.

The catechism is not an "add on" to the Bible, but rather a book that helps us understand the Bible and incorporate its teachings into our life.

The most recent edition of the catechism, which came out in 2017, includes Martin Luther's original catechism. In these first 40 pages you will find the six chief parts of what we believe summarized, along with daily prayers, the table of duties, and questions to ask when going to the Lord's Supper. The next 300 plus pages address these six chief teachings of the Christian faith in greater detail while addressing several contemporary questions. In this section numerous Bible passages are provided that back up key Christian teachings.

I would highly recommend incorporating Luther's catechism into your devotional life, by meditating on the six chief parts and the explanations. In addition, having the 300 plus pages of the catechism's explanation serves as a great resource in learning what we believe and why we believe it.
